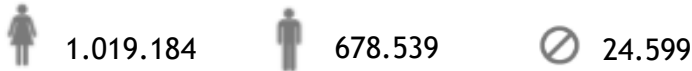

9.005 kits (relief, hygiene, blankets...) distributed to vulnerable people in confinement or isolation in exceptional circumstances.

2.221.758 articles of personal protective equipment distributed to general population.

727.964 people reached through contacts (agendas) to disseminate prevention and contention measures, adapting messages to specific vulnerable groups and identifying needs.



Bio-measures and symptoms monitoring: 31.685 people and 69.619 follow-ups.



Accompaniment to health facilities: 742 people and 1.426 accompaniments.



Psychosocial assistance: 3.431 people and 7.419 follow-ups.



Pharmacological assistance: 14.117 people and 18.559 deliveries.

Food and essential non-food items: 631.718 people and 935.425 deliveries.



Cash assistance: 49.553 people and 65.083 deliveries.



Accompaniment for essential procedures (shopping, bank...): 49.334 people and 74.787 mobilizations.



Social information (to elderly people, women affected by gender-based violence and other vulnerable groups): 228.567 people and 313.994 contacts for information.



Social accompaniment by phone to people in situation of loneliness: 22.845 people and 60.686 agendas.



Social Emergency Units: 1.330 vehicles.



Support for shelter: 4.494 people

Information about employment: 18.700 people and 22.688 activities.



Labour orientation: 22.252 people and 24.403 activities.



EDUCATION



COVID-19 course for responders (including personal protection equipment procedures and other safety measures) and **psychosocial support courses:** 42.237 volunteers and staff



297.277 people have taken the Red Cross COVID-19 online course.



71.751 people have taken the Red Cross first aid, emotional wellbeing... online course.



School support: 12.419 kids and 61.243 activities.



Online training for employment: 327 people and 673 workshops.

49.014 volunteers mobilised in response to COVID-19.

6.154 staff mobilised in response of the emergency and in health facilities.
